

Title: CRM 4712 Criminal Justice Ethics

Course Description: Overviews and discusses through lectures, class discussions and exercises, ethical issues in criminal justice. Develops understanding of the moral and ethical dilemmas of criminal justice practitioners and how they may be successfully resolved.

Major Topics Covered

1. Discuss the purpose of studying ethics in criminal justice. (4 hr)
2. Define key terms in value systems, ethics and ethical decision making. (4 hr)
3. Distinguish norms and values particular to the criminal justice environment and discuss how they impact ethical issues. (4 hr)
4. Identify how the law has redefined acceptable behavior over time. (4 hr)
5. Apply ethical decision making tools to hypothetical situations in a Criminal Justice environment. (4 hr)
6. Evaluate case studies to identify ethical dilemmas. (2 hr).
7. Analyze Criminal Justice policies for appropriate ethical intent and standards. (4 hr)
8. Discuss corruption, use of force, civil rights, and human rights as ethical issues. (4 hr)
9. Analyze how to select, promote, and train to reinforce good character and ethical behavior. (5 hr)
10. Develop critical thinking skills to evaluate ethical problems and propose solutions. (4 hr)

8. Discuss ethics, corruption, use of force, and human rights as comparative CJ issues. (4 hr)
9. Analyze how terrorism and organized crime are perceived and approached domestically and by other nations. (4 hr)
10. Analyze the effects of globalization and its impact on criminal justice systems. (8 hr)
