All **DOMESTIC STUDENTS** MUST bring some form of a picture ID and their printed Panther Pass with them to check-in. All **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS** MUST bring their passport, I-20 and their printed Panther Pass with them to check-in. **ALL STUDENTS** (regardless of whether they have registered or not) will need to check in on Thursday. All students will be required to complete Panther Pass and bring a printed pass with them to check-in. Upon arrival, students will be provided with a checklist of items that will need to be completed to ensure they are ready for classes. The process can take as little as 20 minutes or as long as 5 hours depending on the status of Panther Pass.
